What is Street Level Health Project ?

Street Level Health Project is an Oakland-based grassroots organization dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of underserved urban immigrant communities in the Bay Area.



Street Level Health Project is an entry point to the healthcare and social service system for those most often overlooked, namely the uninsured, underinsured, undocumented, and recent immigrants.

To ensure culturally responsive service delivery, our **FREE** Health Access Program services are provided in a community center rather than a clinical setting. We prioritize an expansive approach to healthcare that reaches beyond traditional medical models. Patients at our center have access to an integrated medical approach that prioritizes health screenings, mental health and nutrition consultations, healthy food program, referral services, as well as a space to build community and engage disconnected immigrants in systemic change.

Job/learning opportunities include patient medical intake (which includes vitals and basic lab tests), working knowledge of community resources, client referral and follow-up care.

RECOMMENDED & REQUIRED SKILLS: Volunteers must speak Spanish fluently. No experience in a clinical environment is necessary, training is provided. Experience working in immigrant communities and cultural humility are very valuable.

SCHEDULE: Monday 9am-4pm and Wednesday 12:00pm to 6pm. Applications are considered only if the applicant can commit six months.
